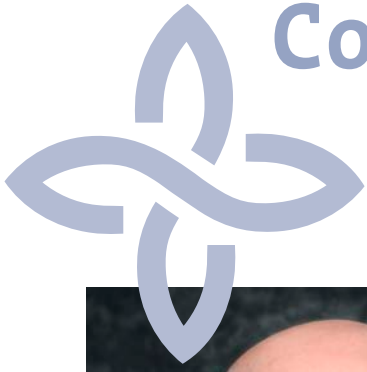

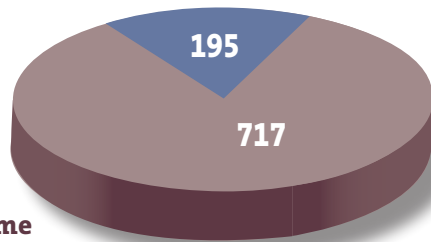
Growth in Number of Employees

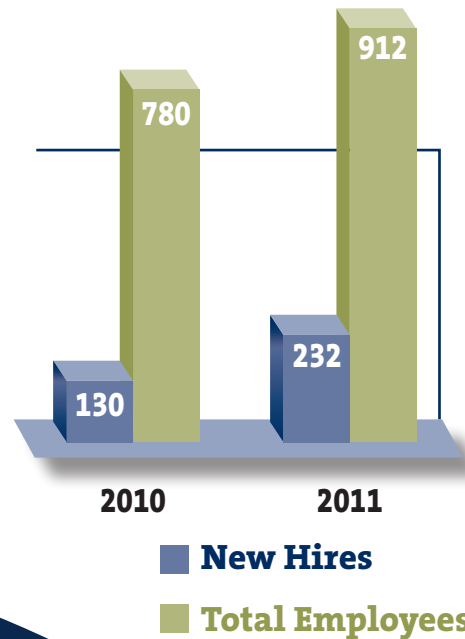

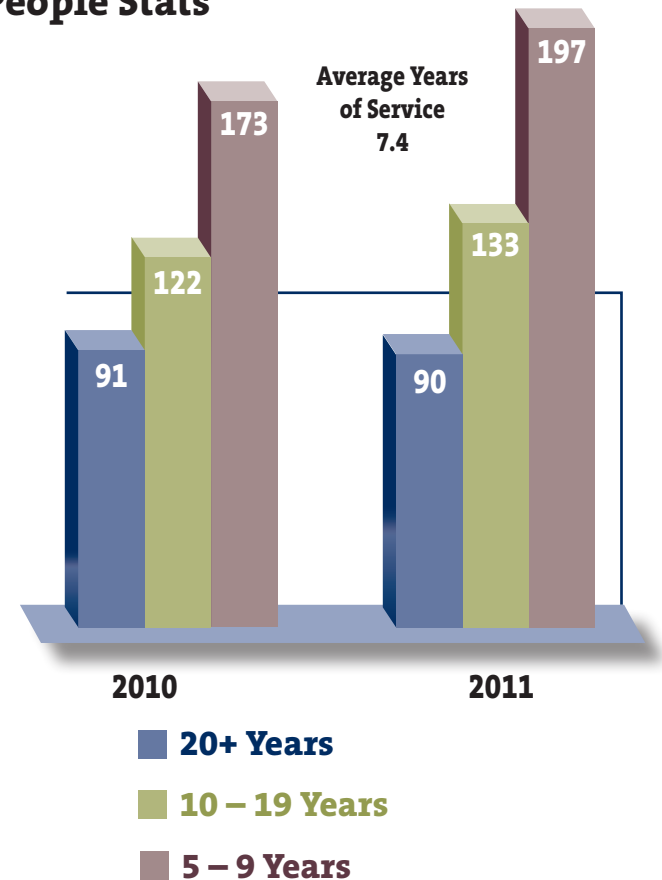

We are very fortunate to be in a community that values volunteerism and giving of one's time. Our 109 volunteers in 2010 and 2011 gave a combined total of 32,493 hours. They provide a valuable service in many of our hospital areas and departments such as the gift shop, surgery waiting area, visitor information, central registration, Center for Cancer Care and as lab couriers, just to name a few. Their hours in 2011 alone equaled that of 8 full-time employees. Our volunteers include men and women ages 14 to an amazing 92!

Partnering with area schools, colleges and universities, KCH has cooperative programs that include job shadowing, mentoring and preceptor programs. In 2010-2011, area students spent 64,500 hours in 34 departments.

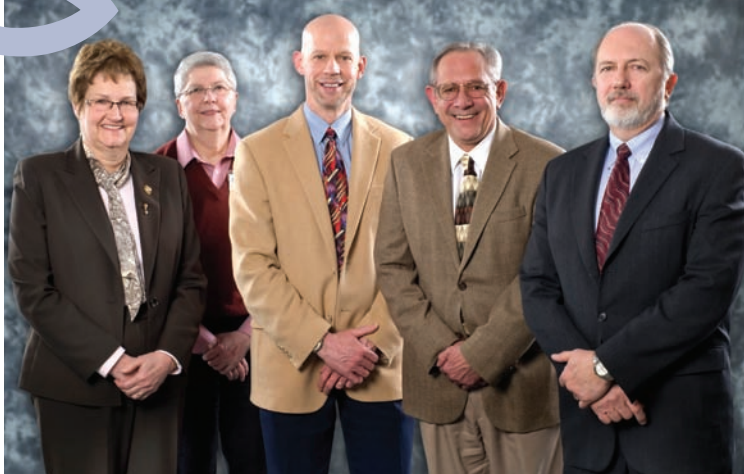

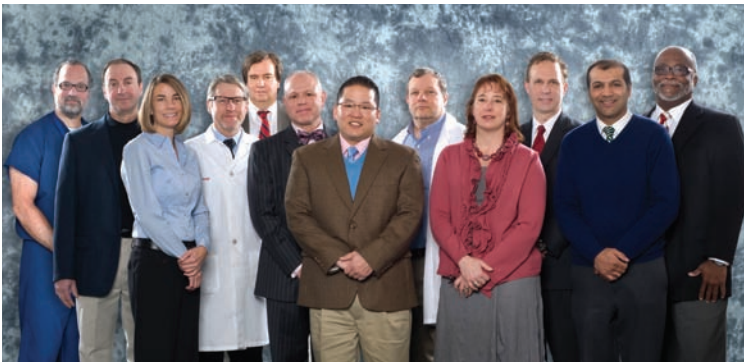

The planning for Knox Community Hospital's Urgent Care Center began quite a while ago. There is a need for walk-in, immediate care for those minor injuries and illnesses that are not serious enough to be seen in the Emergency Department, but require more immediate attention than may be available through a physician's typical office hours.

Every parent knows that an earache, cough or sore throat doesn't show up until after 6 pm (and usually on a Friday!). There are also plenty of times that a minor injury occurs after business hours and, while it may not rise to the level of an emergency, waiting until the next day just isn't an option. These are the very situations where Urgent Care fills the need; and we are pleased to be able to provide this new service.

The Center for Pain Management offers the most advanced treatments. Many of these are less invasive and very effective in getting patients back to a "normal" life.

Partnering with the school systems in Fredericktown and Centerburg, Knox Community Hospital offers supervised wellness programs for people of all ages. KCH also enhanced medical services in Danville and Fredericktown with additional providers. Another way to be in the community.....for the community.





Paragon (McKesson) is powered by many network servers like the one above. With multiple built-in back up systems and fast response times, hospital staff can provide better, safer patient care.

KCH is in the process of implementing a new Hospital Information System (HIS) that will help KCH achieve Stage 1 of the Center for Medicare and Medicaid's Meaningful Use requirement. This will be done through the implementation of Paragon, an industry-leading HIS. The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 specifies three main components of Meaningful Use:

The use of a certified electronic health record (EHR) in a meaningful manner, such as e-prescribing; the use of certified EHR technology for electronic exchange of health information to improve quality of health care and the use of certified EHR technology to submit clinical quality and other measures.

Simply put, "Meaningful Use" means providers need to show they are using certified EHR technology in ways that can be measured significantly in quality and in quantity.

The hospital's new Electronic Health Record system offers a broad suite of multidisciplinary clinical applications that will disseminate patients' care information seamlessly from one care unit to another, from one physician to another, and all other caregivers. The estimated cost of this project is \$6 million. Stage 1 is likely to be completed in June of 2012.

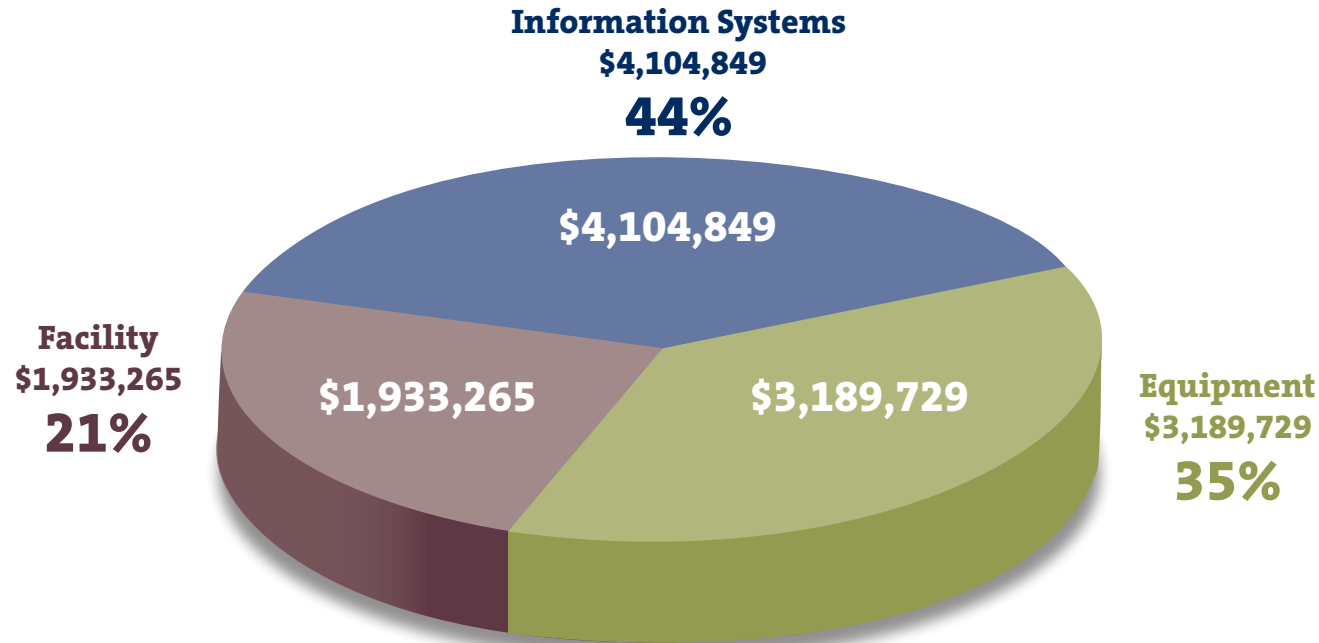

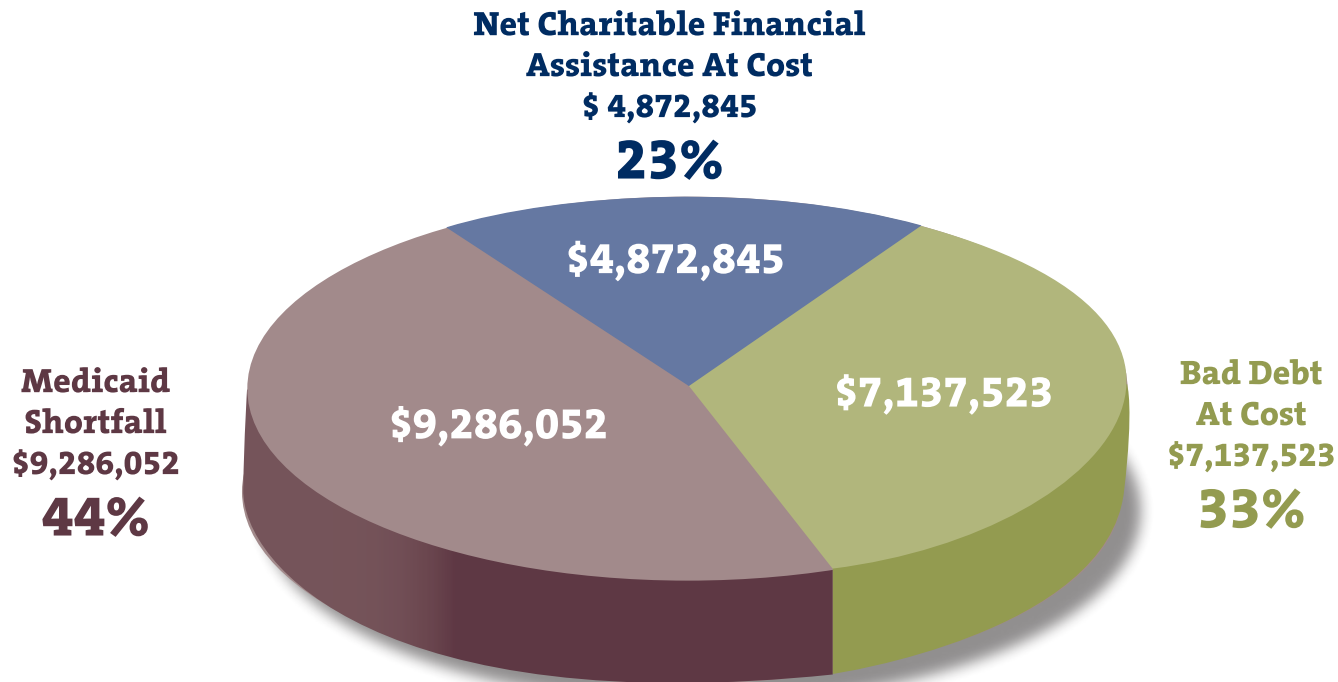

Unreimbursed Cost of Care Total: \$21,296,420

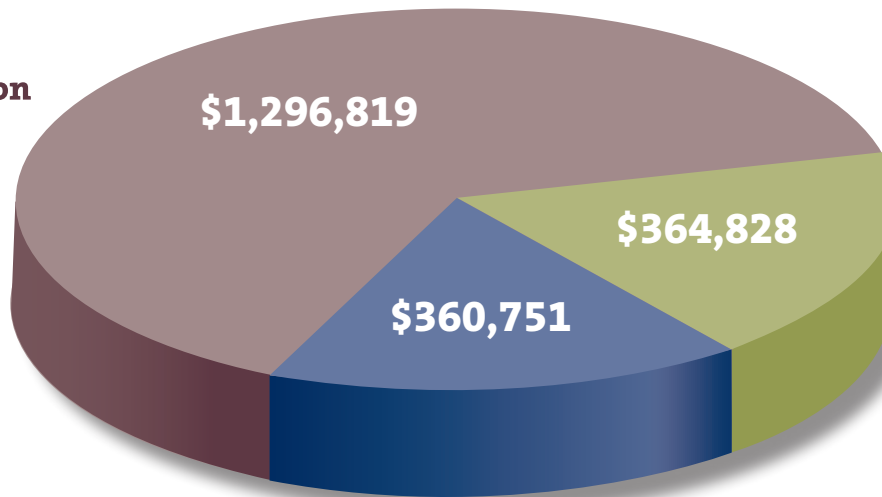

Dear Friends,

As I continued to have the privilege to be chair of The Foundation for Knox Community Hospital, I was once again humbled by the generosity of our community.

In 2010, proceeds from the "Gift for the Heart" campaign were used to purchase equipment for Knox Community Hospital's cardiovascular services. The Foundation equipped 22 emergency vehicles with a modem to transmit information to the LifeNet Receiving Station in the KCH Emergency Department. This allows the cardiologist to have a lifesaving head start in assembling his team as the patient is transported to the ED. Other purchases included two cardiographs; software technology; and an IntraAortic Balloon Pump; two ellipticals and a Life Fit Gym for the KCH cardiac rehabilitation area.

In 2011, The Foundation raised over \$335,000 to purchase equipment to enhance endoscopic services for the newly added endoscopy suites at the hospital. The latest in gastroscopes and endoscopes were purchased to aid in the prevention of or in the early detection of life-threatening illnesses.

I always say, we live in a great community with great people who have very caring hearts. On behalf of The Foundation Board, I encourage you to please continue to support The Foundation for Knox Community Hospital. Great things are happening at Knox Community Hospital and with your help we can continue to help improve the health care of our community.
