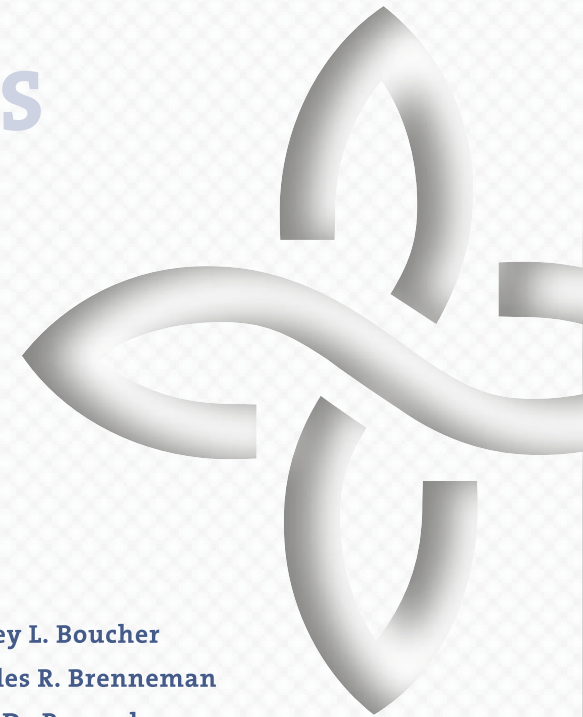

Investment in the Community

Knox Community Hospital is dedicated to offering the highest quality acute healthcare services for Knox County residents. Each year, KCH makes significant investments in our ability to fulfill this mission — purchasing new equipment, launching new services, hiring new physicians and clinical staff, and ensuring our ability to deliver excellent service to our patients.

Over the past two years, the investments KCH has made are improving the quality of life in Knox County. A brand-new cardiac catheterization laboratory has made KCH a state leader in early heart attack care. Upgrades to our Perioperative Unit and Birthing Center are ensuring comfortable healing environments for our patients. New services such as New Vision are offering medical stabilization for those suffering from drug or alcohol addiction. And our implementation of our Electronic Medical Records system has been recognized as among the top 15% of all hospitals nationwide.

KCH continues to make these investments because we believe in our community, and take seriously our role in making Knox County and healthier and happier place to live.



New Cardiac Cath Lab



When it comes to heart health, time is muscle. In the event of a heart attack, every minute matters. That is why Knox Community Hospital has invested in a new state-of-the-art cardiac catheterization laboratory. From the moment 911 is called—and 911 should always be called if you suspect you are having a heart attack—our team is preparing to provide the critical services necessary. Local EMS units are each equipped to transmit vital information to KCH directly from the field, which allows us to expedite each patient's care.

KCH is proud that our "door-to-balloon time"—the time between a patient arriving at our Emergency Department and the time our providers have opened a blocked artery—is well below state and national averages. This is a testament to our partnerships with first responders and our investment in catheterization labs that are the equal of any hospital in Ohio.

No one wants to have a heart attack. But if you do, it is good to know KCH is ready to provide the best possible care.

Perioperative and Birthing Center Upgrades

At Knox Community Hospital, we understand that environment matters. Our investments in upgrading our Perioperative Units and remodeling our Birthing Center demonstrate our commitment to ensuring a safe, comfortable healing environment for our patients. Whether having surgery or expecting a baby, our friends and neighbors deserve the best possible environment for their care.

Knox Community Hospital Perioperative Services provides care for every surgical patient, both inpatients and outpatients, and provides a comprehensive clinical experience. Perioperative departments include: Pre-Surgical Screening, Ambulatory Surgery Unit, Surgery Department, Post Anesthesia Care Unit and Central Sterile.

The KCH Birthing Center offers beautiful and spacious suites, enabling mothers and babies to remain in one room throughout labor, delivery, recovery, and postpartum care. These suites offer a home-like setting with a sleeper sofa to accommodate overnight guests, such as tired new fathers. All the medical equipment is brought to the patients, so they can relax knowing everything is centered around them.



Creating a Healing Environment

LINX

Under the guidance of Dr. Paul Taiganides, the KCH Heartburn Treatment Center is a world-wide leader in a revolutionary new treatment for chronic heartburn—LINX.

The LINX System is a small flexible band of interlinked titanium beads with magnetic cores. The magnetic attraction between the beads is intended to help the lower esophageal sphincter (LES) resist opening to gastric pressures, preventing reflux from the stomach into the esophagus. LINX is designed so that swallowing forces temporarily break the magnetic bond, allowing food and liquid to pass normally into the stomach. Magnetic attraction of the device is designed to close the LES immediately after swallowing, restoring the body's natural barrier to reflux.

Patients are placed under general anesthesia during the procedure, which generally lasts less than an hour. The LINX System does not require any anatomic alteration of the stomach. Most patients go home the day after surgery and resume a normal diet.

This procedure is revolutionizing the treatment of chronic heartburn around the world, and Knox Community Hospital is proud to be at the forefront of this life-changing procedure.

New Vision and EMR

Knox Community Hospital is committed to responding to the needs of our community and adapting to an ever-changing healthcare environment. Recently, we partnered with New Vision to offer an inpatient medical stabilization service for adults with drug, alcohol, or related issues. The service includes pre-screening, assessment, admission, medical stabilization, and an appropriate discharge plan for qualified patients. New Vision also offers a fully qualified treatment team including an attending physician and nursing personnel who utilize a multidisciplinary team approach in the stabilization of the patient.

As the healthcare industry moves toward a standard of Electronic Medical Records utilization, KCH is once again leading the way. We have invested millions of dollars in our implementation of McKesson's Paragon Hospital Information System. This investment offers a broad suite of multidisciplinary clinical applications that will disseminate patients' care information seamlessly from one care unit to another, from one physician to another, and between all other caregivers. KCH was recently recognized by HIMSS Analytics for achieving Stage 6 (out of 7 stages) in EMR adoption, distinguishing our facility as one of the top 15% of hospitals nationwide.



Community Benefits

Community benefit programs enhance the health of our community in a variety of ways—health promotions, health screenings, medical education and community support—and exist to improve the lives of the people we serve. These activities go above and beyond the daily care of our patients.

Community health support and screenings includes education lectures and the Meals on Wheels program. Health profession education is comprised of clinical opportunities for nursing students and medical staff education. Community building activities offer financial and in-kind support, community health advocacy and workforce development. 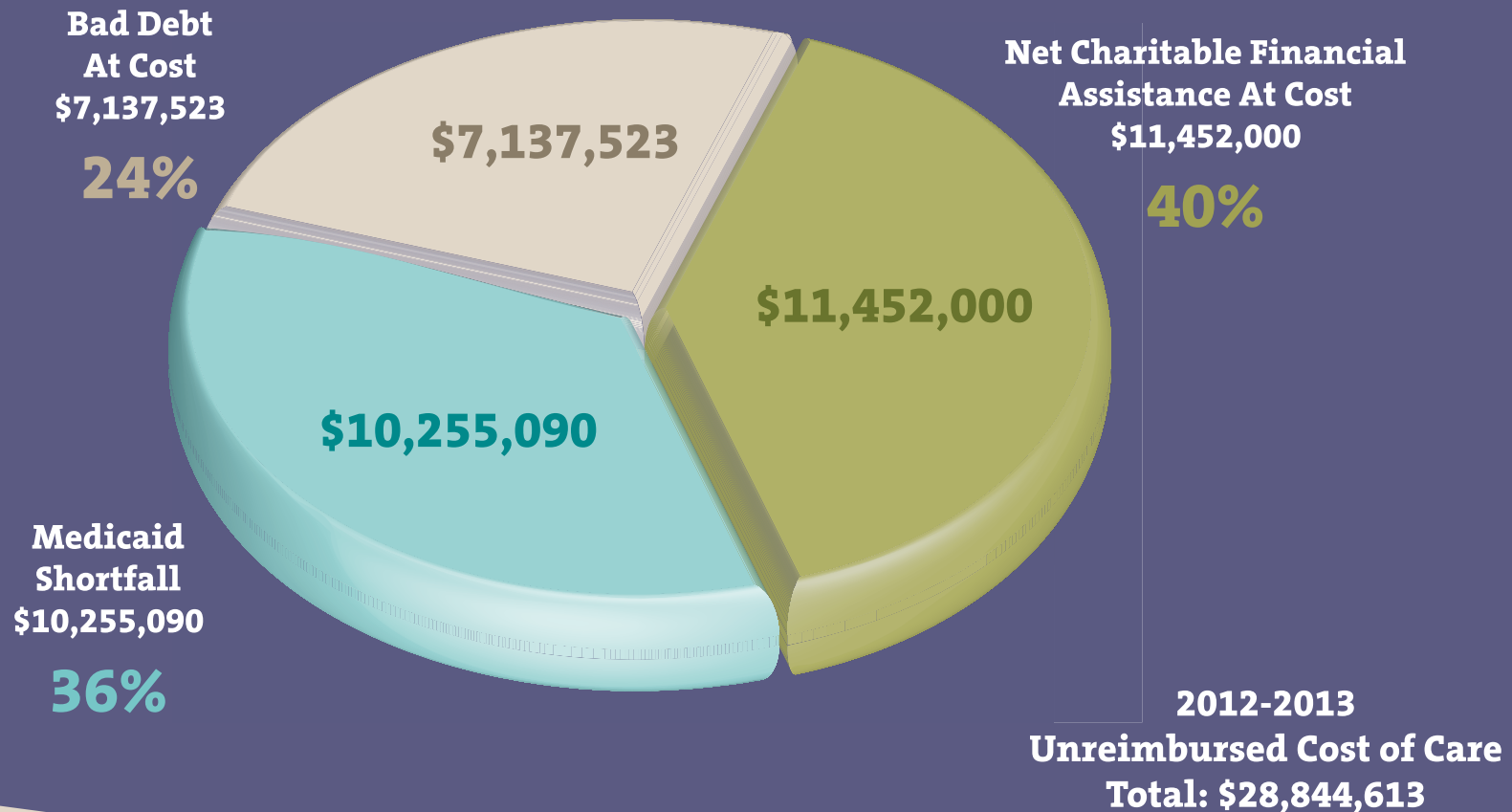
2012-2013 Community Benefit Summary

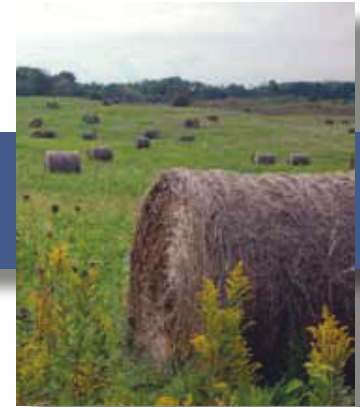
